Protect our Storm Water Drainage Systems

The Town of Haverhill is regulated by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program. This program regulates storm water discharges that lead directly to surface waters. The storm water drainage system collects all the rain water that runs off hard surfaces such as roofs and sidewalks. This storm water runoff drains into catch basins. If that runoff contains pollutants, then those pollutants are routed to the nearest canal, lake and eventually the ocean. Water pollution damages the environment and wildlife and can restrict recreational activities like fishing, swimming and boating.

Please help us protect our waterways by controlling discharge pollution. Be aware of an accidental oil or paint spill, soapy wash water, wastewater and grease that may be draining into our catch basins. These are pollutants and illicit discharges. Please do not blow grass clippings into the storm drains and remind landscapers not to as well.


Trunk or Treat Event

Municipal Election

The Town of Haverhill will hold its Municipal Election on March 19, 2024. Seats 1 and 2 are up for re-election for a three year term. Those registered electors meeting the criteria to run for office may qualify with the Town's filing officer between noon Tuesday, November 14, 2023 through noon Tuesday, November 28, 2023. Those persons wishing to qualify must be a registered voter and shall have continuously resided, and made their place of domicile, within the municipal limits of the Town of Haverhill, in a place which is a fixed and permanent dwelling structure, during the one (1) year period prior to the first day of qualifying. Solid Waste Authority Tips



Put your waste in the proper place, such as bulk items. Bulk items include appliances, furniture and other large household items that don't fit in your garbage bin. All bulk items at the curb for disposal should be at least three feet away from water or gas meters, mailboxes and fire hydrants, and not under utility wires or low hanging branches.

If you want to dispose of your bulk waste items yourself, the Solid Waste Authority offers residents a Customer Convenience Drop-off Center (CCDC) at the North County Landfill, 6330 N. Jog Road in West Palm Beach. Disposal at the CCDC does come with a tipping fee payable by cash or card.

The Solid Waste Authority (SWA) invites you to join your fellow residents to Recycle Right in 2023. The SWA understands that it can be confusing to know what goes in your yellow bin, what goes in your blue recycling bin, and what should be tossed in the trash - we're here to help. Use the search tool found at SWA.org/IsItRecyclable to see if an item is recyclable. If it is, we'll even tell you which bin to put it in.

Here are some recycling tips to help you get started:

General Recycling:

- Definitely put aluminum cans in the blue bin.
- Never place a plastic bag in your blue or yellow bin.
- Recycle all your cardboard boxes in the yellow bin. Be sure to break the boxes down and take out packaging. If you have oversized cardboard boxes, there are hundreds of yellow community drop-offs around PBC. Find your nearest one at <u>SWA.org/WhereToRecycle</u>.
- Plastic caps can stay on plastic bottles, but take metal lids off of glass bottles and jars.
- When in doubt, throw it out. Trying to recycle things like holiday lights, garden hoses and children's toys in your blue or yellow recycle bin can contaminate recyclables or even damage recycling processing equipment, so please throw those items in the trash.

Household hazardous waste items to take to a Home Chemical and Recycling Center:

- Batteries Rechargeable batteries, car or boat batteries, and nickel-cadmium and lithium-ion batteries can all go to an HCRC.
- Electronics Old electronics like cell phones, computers and TVs are actually considered household hazardous waste and can be taken to an HCRC for free residential disposal.
- Light Bulbs Fluorescent bulbs, even the little curly-cue compacts, have mercury in them which is a hazardous waste and should be taken to an HCRC or a home improvement store.
- Chemicals If your garage is full of home chemicals like oil, gasoline and solvents, much of it can be taken to an HCRC.
- Paint Do you have old paint? Take it to an HCRC where old latex paint is sent to be recycled into new paint and donated to PBC families in need.
